

Recycling


You can make a contribution to our huge recycling program by bringing in all your empty cans and batteries..

How can I help my child?

There is a lot of research which shows children do better at school when their parents are involved. As a parent/carer, your partnership with the school is really important. Ask the teacher how you can help your child at home build on the maths they are learning in class. Help your child enjoy the maths they do at school by talking positively at home. *What did you learn in maths today?* And *Can you show me how you did it?* It's a simple way to show your child you are interested in their school work. Don't expect your child to learn maths the same way you were taught at school. It's more helpful to share the ways you find easiest to work things out. Keep in touch with the school. Go to parent meetings and volunteer your time if you can. Your child will be proud when you turn up in class.

SWAN VIEW SHOW

Hello my name is Stephen O'Callaghan the President of the Swan View Show Committee and I would like to inform you on this year's 68th Swan View Show.



Some history: Immediately after World War II Swan View was mainly a primary producing area, with vineyards, small farms and little in the way of suburban housing.

Seventy years ago in 1946 a number of residents in the district felt that it would be a good idea to promote an event that could bring people together in a social atmosphere. It was decided that a flower show could be presented. A committee was formed and a very successful show resulted. In 1947 following another popular flower event, it was agreed that the format should be developed as an agricultural show. A new committee was formed and the Swan View Agricultural & Arts Society was founded and the first Swan View Show was held in 1948 at Brown Park.

The Swan View Show has been a supporter of your schools in this area for many years promoting many activities and exhibits.

This year the show will return to its original date, the first Saturday after the Royal Perth Show and will extend its hours into the early evening. The Swan View Show is committed to engage the community in 'life on the land' by showing agriculture that was, that is and what could be in our displays and activities. The Swan View Show also is committed to this community and will have a diverse range of attractions and exhibitions of Produce, Flowers, Arts, Cooking, Poultry, Schools Art displays and we cannot forget the Pets.

It is the committees goal to return the Swan View Show to the must attend community event it was. This year's event is to be the best yet, but this can only happen with your help.
